MAY CHALLENGE

Medical Plan

The World Mission Department provides medical, dental, and vision coverage to contracted missionaries and their dependents. This coverage includes doctors, hospitals, prescription medicine, and optical, dental, and auditory expenses. A life insurance and long-term disability policy is also included.

The approximate cost of medical expenses for a missionary is \$5,040 annually or \$420 monthly. The total approximate medical cost for keeping the current contracted missionaries on the field for a year is \$2,920,819.

The NMI Medical Plan offerings through Distinguished Service Awards, Memorial Rolls, Gifts from the Heart, and plate offerings provide approximately \$500,000 a year. The need is great. Let's support our missionaries by giving to the Medical Plan.

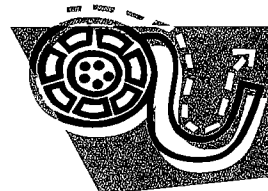
If your LINKS missionary was John and Janice Nielson (they are on leave from missionary service) you are assigned Brenda Gould for the rest of the year up to District Convention.

JESUS Film Ministry (As of March 30, 2005)

JESUS Film Ministry Teams have reported 32,875,715 viewers of the JESUS Film through March 30, 2005. Of these viewers, 4,754,685 (14.5% of viewers) have indicated decisions for Christ and 1,813,598 (38.1% of decisions) are initial discipleship contacts. There have been 5,778 new churches started and 12,665 new pastors are in training. Please pray for these new starts and the pastors in training! 152 JESUS Film language translations used. 98 countries where the JESUS Film is used.

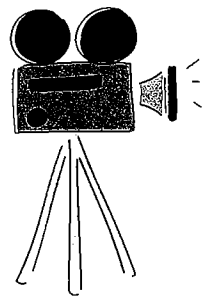

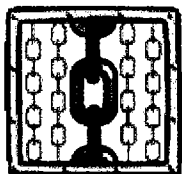

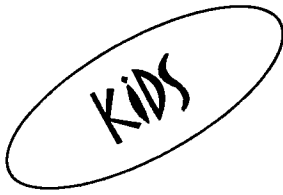

2005-2006

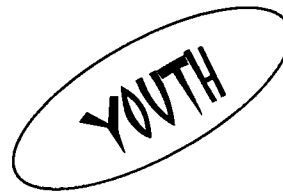

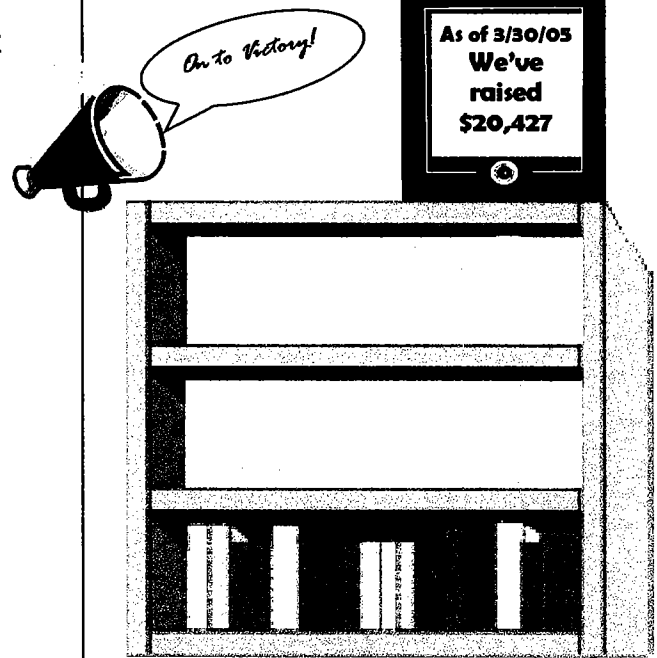
● 90th Anniversary Video (on DVD)

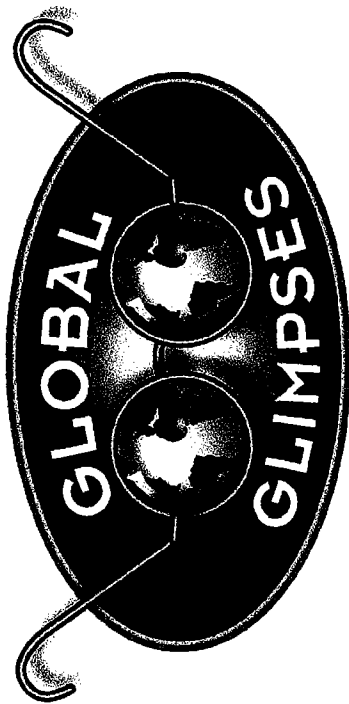

NAZARENE SCENE

Tsunami Disaster—On December 26, 2004, the world's most powerful earthquake in 40 years struck six miles deep under the Indian Ocean, causing massive tsunami waves that obliterated villages and seaside resorts in as many as 11 countries across southern Asia. Within hours of the disaster, Nazarene Compassionate Ministries (NCM) mobilized local field workers in India to respond to the need. Nazarenes worldwide responded by giving to NCM, providing for ongoing efforts to respond to the needs with short- and long-term aid.

"Books for Pastors" Walk—In November 2004, Africa Nazarene University (ANU) students, faculty, and staff participated in a walk to raise funds for the NMI 90th Anniversary Project: "Books for Pastors—Tools for Ministry." Dr. Leah Marangu, vice chancellor of ANU, led the challenging six-mile walk. The line of participants stretched nearly two miles, as Christian and Muslim students walked side-by-side and celebrated together at the finish line.

Nazarenes Affected by Guyana Floods—Heavy rains drenched parts of Guyana with

launched a program specifically targeted to evangelize and disciple children. WMB South America (SAM) partnered with the SAM Region Sunday School Ministries to introduce "Adventures with Buzzy," which broadcasts throughout Latin America. The program is designed for children between the ages of 4-11 and addresses many issues Latin children face daily.

World Mission Broadcast

24/7 Prayer Plan—During the General Assembly and Conventions, concerts of prayer for the event will be held worldwide. Each world region, Canada, and the United States have been assigned a day to pray during the General Assembly and Conventions. First International Youth in Mission Team Visits U.S.A.—Youth in Mission (YIM), World Mission Department, recently announced that the first-ever international YIM team will come to the U.S.A. in summer 2005 for multicultural ministries. The team includes one participant from each of the six world mission regions.

NMI 90th Anniversary Project Extended—In light of the tsunami disaster and the support of a special relief offering to help with the needs, the General NMI Council has extended the "Books for Pastors" Project to include the church year 2005-06. Opportunities for giving will be provided and districts' giving will be recognized at the 2005 General NMI Convention in June.

WORLD SCENE

Iraqi Christians Face Persecution—Christians in Iraq are facing increased hostility from hard-line Islamic groups, who

accuse believers of being sympathetic to the Western forces and civilian contractors. Ten thousand to 30,000 of Iraq's 800,000 Christians have fled the country since the fall of Saddam Hussein's regime, most of them traveling to Syria. While Christians comprise only 3 percent of the 25 million people in Iraq, they account for 20 percent of the refugees fleeing the country.

Church Around the World

Gospel Spreading in Romania—According to *Church Around the World*, the Gospel has spread across Romania since Communist dictator Nicolae Ceausescu was overthrown and executed in 1989. The rapid response to the Gospel has resulted in at least 4,000 new churches in the last 15 years. Please continue to pray for Romania, that the Lord will provide well-trained pastors for the new churches.

JESUS Film on the Internet—The JESUS Film Project provides the JESUS film for viewing online. In 2003, the film was available in 59 different languages, with more added each year. To view the JESUS film online, visit <www.jesusfilm.org>.

- JESUS Film Harvest Partners Ministry reports 32,193,463 evangelistic contacts have been made (through the JESUS film and other tools) and 4,678,463 people have made decisions for Christ, as of February 2005.

 - About 100,000 of North Korea's Christians are currently imprisoned for their faith.
 - In Zimbabwe, the average life expectancy is 33 years, and 25 percent of the population is HIV positive.
